Topics of interest include: (i) the political determination of public policies (fiscal and monetary policy, social insurance, taxation, transfer programs, public investment, public employment, regulation, education, and health); (ii) the effects of political reforms; (iii) inefficiencies arising from lack of commitment, private information, the bargaining process, and political failures; (iv) the impact of budgeting rules; (v) political polarization and partisan conflict; (vi) the political economy of defaults; (v) politics, policies, and international finance; among others.
